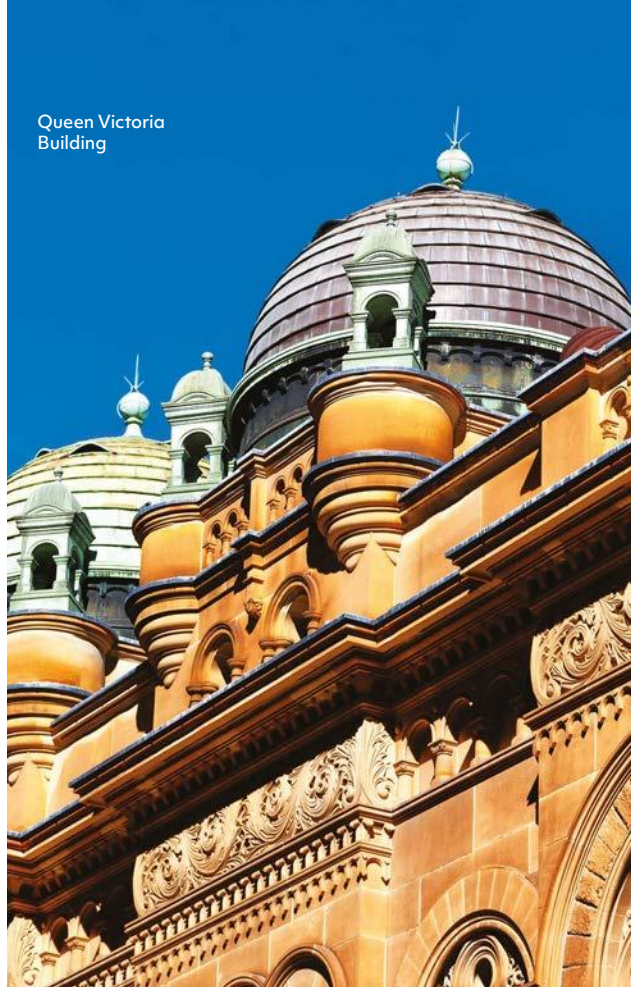

EXPLORE

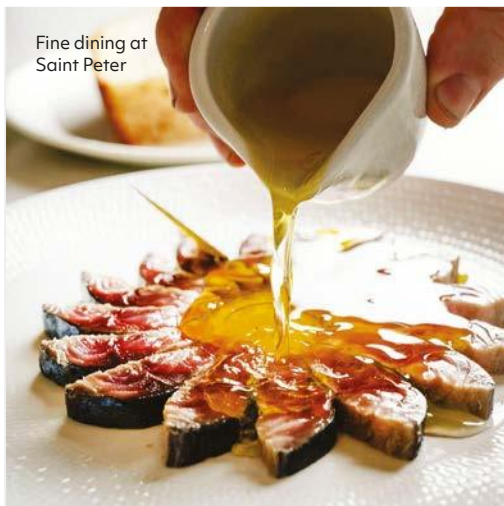
Almost everyone's first stop in the city is the gleaming Sydney Opera House. Once you've posed for a photo, hop aboard the F9 ferry to Watsons Bay. You'll get another view of the beloved concert hall as you sail past mansions and coves on your way to this small village, where you can feast on fresh fish and chips at Doyles on the Beach Restaurant. For more seaside adventure, complete the quintessential Bondi to Coogee Coastal Walk. This roughly four-mile route takes between two and three hours to complete, but if you stop off at any number of its pristine, sandy coves for a swim, surf or game of volleyball, it could take all day.

DINE

Known for farm-fresh produce and seafood, Sydney loves to dine out. If you're chasing something that used to swim, chef Josh Niland celebrates every part of the fish at his fine-dining spot, Saint Peter. Another local go-to is Mr. Wong. There, they serve every Cantonese dish you can think of, but the dim sum lunch is why you go. Across town, handmade pasta is a must at Totti's Bondi, though its selection of antipasti, particularly the salty ling dip and wood-fired bread, is the star. For more Australian flavors, book a table at Ester and try the blood sausage sanga, and be sure to leave room for the pavlova dessert.

SHOP

Sydney may not have the same fashion cred as Melbourne, but there are still plenty of boutiques to peruse. MAARA Collective is an Indigenous-owned clothing brand sold at the David Jones department store in Sydney's CBD. Made of natural fibers and

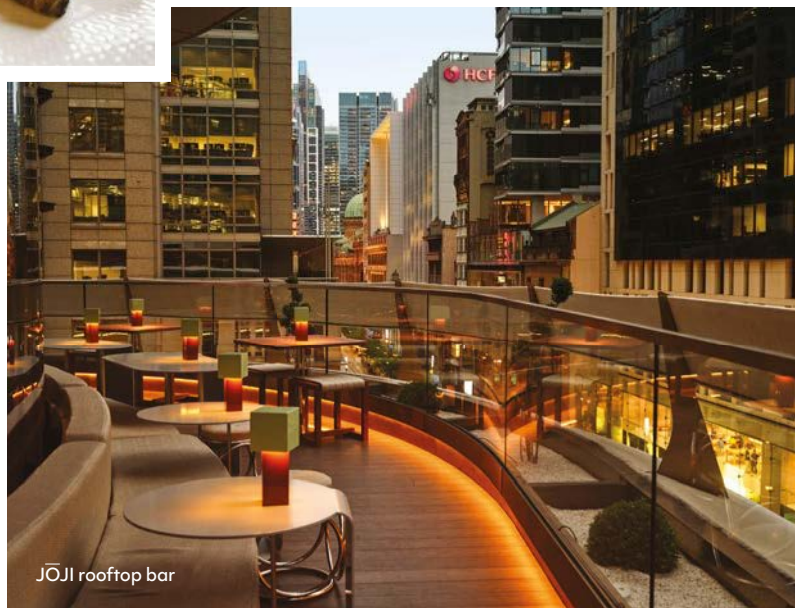


Fine dining at Saint Peter

featuring Aboriginal patterns, outfits here are primed for an evening out on the town. Wander the Queen Victoria Building, admiring its 1800s architecture, locally made confections at Haigh's Chocolates and bevy of name-brand stores. For creative souvenirs, walk to the store at the Museum of Contemporary Art Australia for Australian-themed home goods, tote bags, clothing and jewelry.

SIP

Aussies have been known to enjoy a glass or two, so it's no surprise that the bar scene in Sydney is booming. At Dulcie's Kings Cross, every spirit at the moody downstairs bar is made in Australia. Try pavlova vodka or a rare Outback gin in your martini. JŌJI is a new rooftop bar in the city's center that highlights wabi-sabi Japanese cocktails, including a take on the espresso martini flavored with miso and Okinawa caramel. For a more fabulous rooftop vantage point, book a table at the Glenmore in the Rocks featuring priceless views of Sydney Harbour.

Bursting with history and charm, Vietnam's capital city vibrates with an intoxicating energy. Romantic architecture – a vestige of the city's French colonial past – provides a striking contrast to the honking motorbikes, smoking street grills and blaring karaoke music that will plant you firmly in Vietnam's present. Explore the country's best cuisine, hole-in-the-wall cafés and artisan shops, all while getting lost in the bewildering beauty of Vietnam.

EXPLORE

The best introduction to this vibrant city comes with a wander through the Old Quarter. Each of its 36 streets specialize in a different artisan trade or craft, from tin products to sweets to fabrics, with quaint cafés and street-food vendors sprinkled among the shops. For a taste of Hanoi's rich history, plan a visit to the Temple of Literature – and arrive early to avoid the crowds. Located near the city center, the ancient complex is the site of the country's first university and includes preserved gates, peaceful ponds and massive manicured courtyards, all dedicated to Confucius.

DINE

Hanoi is known as Vietnam's food capital, and many of the greatest dishes here are served to diners perched on tiny plastic stools. To experience the local staple bún chả, venture down a narrow, grilled-pork-scented alley to Bún Chả Hàng Quạt, where you can dip your mound of rice noodles into an umami-rich, pork-filled broth and savor the tangle of flavors and textures. Of course, no visit to Vietnam would be complete without a steaming bowl of beef pho from Bib



The Haflington

Gourmand-recommended Phở Gia Truyền Bát Đàn or a crispy pork-filled banh mi from Banh Mi 25. If a sit-down meal is more your style, reserve a table at T.U.N.G Dining and feast on its playful and seasonal tasting menu.

SHOP

For something fun and funky, head to Collective Memory, where Vietnamese-coffee-themed tea towels, local artwork, rice liqueur and tote bags make the perfect souvenirs. In Hanoi's trendy Tay Ho District, buy colorful handmade earrings, a hand-sewn wallet or frameable hand-drawn

postcards at Humanity Hanoi. Then peek into Better World Hanoi, a social enterprise that carries unique statement jewelry and clothing from fair-trade enterprises around the world.

SIP

Between the endless coffee varieties and cool cocktail bars, you won't go thirsty in Hanoi. Saddle up to the posh bar at the Hudson Rooms on the rooftop of the opulent Capella Hanoi hotel. There, you can savor a wide variety of whiskeys from their signature whiskey cart or sip on Champagne while you slurp fresh

oysters. You'll find more top-notch spirits at The Haflington, ranked No. 47 by Asia's 50 Best Bars, where an old-school vibe complements classic yet creative cocktails. Digging the vintage vibes? Find Bee'Znees, a jazz speakeasy hidden behind a bookcase in the Old Quarter, and order one of their mean martinis. The next day, when you're in need of a caffeine hit, head to Loading T Café for a coconut coffee roasted with nutmeg or Hanoi's signature egg coffee at Ma Xó café.

SEOUL

Seoul's appeal lies in the vestiges of its past and its view of the future. South Korea's rapid regeneration has cemented the capital city's standing as an epicenter of regional and global trends in beauty, fashion, pop music and gastronomy, and Seoul's dynamism is a source of great pride to its residents. But centuries-old traditions maintain their hold on this sprawling, green city as well, making any visit a remarkable study in contrasts.

EXPLORE

In the picturesque Jongno District, Seoul's historical core, the streets of Bukchon Hanok Village lead to five royal palaces. At Gyeongbokgung, the largest, visitors often don traditional Korean costumes before exploring the palace and gardens on a free walking tour. Stop in Hanok Tea House before heading to Jogyesa Temple, the center of Korean Buddhism. A visit to the Gangnam District is key to understanding modern Seoul. Start with a wander through Starfield COEX Mall's photogenic Byeolmadang Library before shopping and dining, then end with a facial or foot massage at sleek Spa 1899. At the Yongsan District's Leeum Museum of Art, connoisseurs can explore traditional and modern works by Korean and contemporary artists, while architecture buffs will revel in surroundings designed by Mario Botta, Jean Nouvel and Rem Koolhaas.

DINE

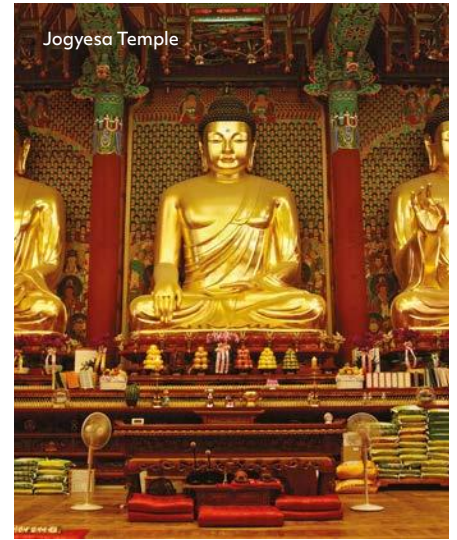
Apgujeong, a trendy ward of the Gangnam District, is a hot spot for dining. Michelin Bib Gourmand pick Mandujip has been serving its delicious take on humble Pyeongando-style dumplings for more than 30 years. At Ggupdang, another Michelin darling that's conveniently located near Sinsa Station, tender cuts of pork are cured for 15 days before being swiftly charcoal grilled on a special aluminum grate. Grilling is also the cooking method of choice at Jowu, where some of the city's best beef omakase is prepared before your eyes over charcoal-filled clay pots.

SHOP

The Garosu-gil area of Gangnam's Sinsa ward is a hub for boutiques, and the selection of sunglasses at Gentle Monster epitomizes the area's classy, retro-meets-contemporary vibe. At nearby

Tamburins, let the lovely staff help you find your perfect fragrance match, then pop into Sulwasoo's flagship store and explore top-notch K-beauty products. For traditional crafts, head up to Jongno's Insadong Cultural Street and pick up your very own dojang (a stone or wood stamp or seal used to sign your name) from Saegimsori or colorful hanji paper at Doori Hanji, where you can join a workshop and make an item of your choice.

SIP

Gangnam's quirky – and hidden – speakeasy Boxing Tiger has the nicest mixologists in the city, who prepare all the classics alongside customized creations. At the Park Hyatt Seoul, the sumptuous vinyl bar Timber House – accessed via a hidden passageway – entices with live music Wednesday through Saturday, a large selection of whiskeys and other spirits, and a delightful array of creative cocktails.

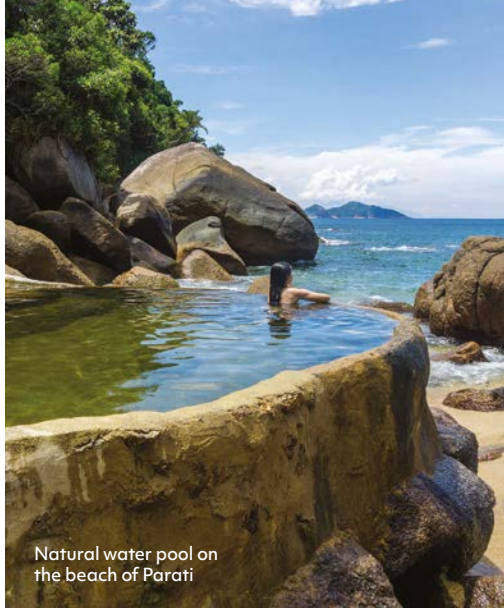
Framed by mountains and paved with cobblestones, Parati is a UNESCO World Heritage site with a picturesque combination of 18th- and 19th-century colonial architecture and

breathhtaking natural beauty. Wander the colorful city center, explore the beaches, shop for artisan goods and sip a Jorge Amado – Parati's signature cocktail – as you explore this enchanting piece of paradise.

EXPLORE

Stroll through the Centro Histórico's car-free cobblestone streets, where the whitewashed buildings adorned with colorful doors and shutters create what UNESCO has described as "the most harmonious colonial architectural complex." Near the waterfront, step into the Capela de Santa Rita, Parati's oldest church, which now houses the Parati Museum of Sacred Art.

Enjoy your verdant surroundings by hiking the tropical fjord Saco do Mamanguá, which is accessible only by sea or walking trail. Daredevils will enjoy sliding down the Cachoeira do Tobogã, one in a series of waterfalls in the preserved Atlantic Forest. The best beaches on the Costa Verde aren't in Parati, but lovely Praia do Jabaquara, near the city center, where chair and umbrella rentals are available to make your outing a breeze.

SHOP

You'll find Parati's finest boutiques along Centro Histórico's charming streets. Pick up a novel at Livraria

das Marés, which offers an assortment of English-language literature. A few doors down at Estilo Brasil Parati, browse local beach-inspired crafts and colorful home décor. Around the corner is Terra Fina Cerâmica, which sells stunning ceramic jewelry. For more ceramics, visit Atelier do Dalcir. Stop in Atelier Na Pele for everything from clothing to candles, then support local Indigenous artisans by taking home handmade wares from Canoa Arte Indígena, including small animal figurines carved from wood.

DINE

To discover the freshest local flavors, book the organic farm tour at Fazenda Bananal, then stay for a farm-to-table meal at the on-site restaurant. If you don't have time for the half-day excursion, you can still enjoy the farm's bounty in town at Quintal das Letras. For an upscale dining experience, order a fresh catch at Prosa Restaurante. Or, if home cooking is what you crave, head to Restaurante Quintal de Mãe and try feijoada, a black-bean stew. For riverfront dining, reserve a table on the balcony at Dona Ondina.

SIP

Cachaça is Brazil's national spirit, and you can learn about its production at local distilleries including Alambique Engenho D'Ouro and Alambique Paratiana. Try a Jorge Amado (Parati's signature cocktail flavored with cloves and cinnamon) at Apothekario, located within the luxurious Sandi Hotel. For fresh juice, stop by Manuê Sucos and sip a frosty, fruity pick-me-up.



Sights *to* Behold

Jeff Jenkins, the charismatic personality behind the inclusive travel blog Chubby Diaries and the adventure series Never Say Never, explores the world – and overcomes his fears – one landmark at a time.

A seasoned traveler who has journeyed to more than 40 countries, Jeff Jenkins still remembers his first visit to Japan nearly 20 years ago like it was yesterday.

“I was struck at how everything was so much smaller,” the former school teacher recalls, “from the French fries at the McDonald’s to the Toyota trucks driving around Tokyo.” Accustomed to the United States’ limitlessness, Jenkins eventually surrendered to Japan’s exquisite, finite precision of being – an experience that left him forever changed.

Recognizing a lack of resources for plus-size travelers in his journeys, Jenkins launched the blog *Chubby Diaries* in 2018 to empower fellow adventurers to live life in the moment. His dedication and desire to make travel accessible for everyone propelled him into the world of content creation. He’s made a career of exploring new destinations, documenting his fanciful encounters both online and on television.

As the host of the National Geographic channel adventure series *Never Say Never*, Jenkins has sumo wrestled in Japan, galloped with gaúchos in Patagonia, rock climbed in the Adirondacks and swam with sharks in Mexico. His inspiring journey from choir teacher to professional globetrotter has garnered thousands of followers on social media, fueled by his passion for boundary-shattering experiences around the world.

“Life begins when your comfort zone ends,” a call to action to overcome fear, embrace change and seek out new experiences.

Worlds Apart

Jenkins' shock at size disparities in Japan on his first visit was not relegated to the nation's diminutiveness. He was equally struck by the enormity of the Great Buddha of Kamakura. "It's like three stories tall," Jenkins recalls.

Nestled amid tranquil gardens, the 37-foot-tall statue has weathered earthquakes and tsunamis.

Standing as a symbol of resilience, the Great Buddha is actually hollow, welcoming visitors within and adding a unique, almost intimate touch to the experience. Jenkins notes that the site's blend of nature, history and craftsmanship makes a visit to the bronze icon a truly unforgettable travel experience, and a must-see for anyone seeking a moment of profound tranquility – or a totally stunning pic for Instagram.

Beyond the sheer number of Buddha statues throughout Japan, Jenkins also recommends keeping an eye out for the ubiquitous *shisa* creatures, guardian lion-dog statues that are enduring symbols of Japan's blend of spirituality and artistry. "They're so cute," Jenkins says. "They're everywhere. There are small ones in temples, and large ones perched atop buildings. You could miss them if you don't pay attention."

Into the Woods

In Brazil, venturing into the Amazonian rainforest transcended the act of mere sightseeing for Jenkins. One of his most memorable moments was communing with a kapok tree. “The roots fan out, but they are more like a wall than a fan,” Jenkins explains of the giants also known as *Ceiba pentandra*. With buttressed roots sprawling outwards like natural fortifications, the trees provide essential stability in the rainforest’s often waterlogged environment.

Beyond their impressive physical presence, kapok trees hold significant ecological

and cultural importance. They can reach astounding heights, and their canopy provides a habitat for countless species of flora and fauna. The kapok’s fluffy seed fibers have been used for centuries in various applications, from stuffing in pillows to life preservers.

A visit to the city of Afuá was also a surreal experience during Jenkins’ visit to Brazil. “It’s like a floating city,” he explains of the destination built primarily on stilts. Located at the mouth of the Amazon River, Afuá doesn’t allow cars and boasts a vibrant community life accessible only by boat. On most nights, residents gather in the city center for dancing and socializing. “It’s a very unique place,” says Jenkins.

Happy Feet

Patagonia, the vast, windswept region at the southern tip of South America, was an exercise in contrasts. Jenkins spent time in Ushuaia, the world’s southernmost city and a gateway for Antarctic expeditions.

Nearby Tierra del Fuego – known as the land of fire – lived up to its name with its dramatic landscapes and unpredictable weather. “It could feel like all four seasons in one day,” Jenkins recalls. Shared by Argentina and Chile, the remote archipelago features dense forests, glacial fjords and the iconic Beagle Channel.

While on Tierra del Fuego, Jenkins encountered the vast penguin population: a mix of Magellanic penguins, nesting in large colonies along the coasts; Gentoo penguins, hanging out on islands; and King penguins, who reside on the Chilean side of Tierra del Fuego, a crucial habitat for the fascinating seabirds. “I was so lucky,” says Jenkins, who witnessed newly hatched chicks on his visit. “The babies were just being born. It was spectacular to see such a rare moment happen right in front of my eyes.”

Sky's the Limit

From the bustling markets of Hanoi to the pristine beauty of Hả Long Bay, Vietnam offered Jenkins a journey that was both exhilarating and moving. It was where he embraced the unexpected and discovered a culture that was as complex and captivating as the traffic patterns in its capital city. Despite crossing dozens of borders, traversing a busy Hanoi street remains one of his most terrifying experiences to date.

"The way that they drive [in Hanoi] is out of this world," says Jenkins, who recently released his first children's book, *Why Not Me?!* "You can cross the street with motor vehicles wildly going by, and they will know how to move around you. People don't hesitate. It's so different from the way we drive [in the U.S.]. It was one of the scariest things I've ever done."

Equally terrifying? Sapa's Rong May Glass Bridge, which sits at an elevation of nearly 2,000 feet above sea level at Ô Quy Hồ Pass. The structure, which features a transparent floor, hovers over a plunging valley and delivers a thrilling mix of terror and awe to visitors. Opened in 2019, the attraction also includes an adjacent suspension bridge to

cross. "It was cool to do," Jenkins recounts. "But I'll never do *that* again."

For an equally captivating but less intense experience, Jenkins recommends making time to appreciate Sapa's terraced rice fields that cling to the mountainsides. "I loved seeing all those layers," he says. "It's not like anything else I've ever witnessed. You really need to make the trek to Sapa for those

incredible, out-of-this-world views."

With dramatic limestone karsts rising from the emerald waters, Hả Long Bay is another highlight that Jenkins recommends visiting. "It feels like they are floating mountains," he says. Jenkins suggests taking the time to cruise through the bay, whether it's a minimalist expedition or luxurious yacht, in order to marvel at the stunning scenery.

HOW TO TRAVEL LIKE JEFF

SEEK DISCOMFORT

Jenkins' personal mantra is that "life begins when your comfort zone ends," a call to action to overcome fear, embrace change and seek out new experiences. "I love traveling," he says, "because it inspires us to compare our lives to how other people live and to see beyond our own bubbles."

TASTE EVERYTHING

Be bold when it comes to sampling local cuisine. "You might try [new food] and think it's nasty," Jenkins says. "That's fine. It was nasty. If it was good, you just tried something that you never knew you liked." Jenkins suggests ordering tasting menus or going on food tours where a variety of smaller options might lead to big discoveries.

DO THE RESEARCH

Jenkins finds immeasurable benefits from following fellow travel bloggers and vloggers. "When I watch videos and do my research, it brings my anxiety down," he attests. "I always suggest that people research their trips because you gain more than just recommendations from it."

TREAT TRAVEL LIKE A GAME

When exploring a new locale, attempt to accomplish – in a reasonable manner, of course – as much as possible. "It should be fun," Jenkins says. "Keep thinking: 'Let's do this. Let's try this. Let's go.'" By adopting a playful mindset, traveling can lead to exciting moments, making them more memorable and rewarding.

athryn Kelly didn't take the most obvious path to Oceania Cruises' kitchens and culinary centers. After completing her

doctoral studies in epidemiology at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, she enjoyed a fulfilling career in health care before changing course later in life to attend the Culinary Institute of America. Now, she pursues her passions for food and travel, sharing them with guests on board Oceania's luxurious ships.

"For 30 years, I traveled all over the world for business, but I never really got to experience where I was in a deeper way," Kelly says. "The way I travel now is all about food, wine and the culinary culture of where I go. I get a real sense of who the people are when I go to local markets and dine in local restaurants."

Kelly's lifelong interest in food and culture informs her work as the founder of Oceania's Culinary Center, where she oversees cooking

classes and a faculty of Chef Instructors. She also heads up its range of Culinary Discovery Tours, immersive chef-led excursions available in more than 40 destinations worldwide.

Onboard classes introduce participants to the cuisines they'll encounter during their voyage, while also imparting techniques that apply to multiple recipes they can make at home. The culinary tours provide a deeper dive into destinations along the cruise itinerary. "Food is one of the most comforting ways to explore a culture," Kelly says, "so it's all about introducing our guests to where they're traveling through the lens of local food traditions."

Kelly is immensely proud of her team and calls the faculty an asset unlike any you'll find on other ships. Plenty of chefs can talk food and teach techniques, but Kelly recruits those who can authentically share tips and recommendations based on their own experiences in Oceania Cruises' destinations. "We really invest in making these experiences unique," Kelly explains, "and the more informed and passionate the chefs are, the better the experience. They understand the local culture and are an incredible resource for guests."

Kelly has traveled and dined all over the world, but there are a handful of destinations that are especially exciting to her right now. "Patagonian cuisine is super-hot," she says, noting its unique combination of mountain,

ocean and indigenous influences. She's also fascinated by Uruguay and its unique style of butchery, which results in cuts and dishes that are much different than those you'll find in meat-obsessed Texas, for example. "The animals are different, and what they eat and how they're cooked is different," Kelly says, noting that Oceania's Culinary Discovery Tours take people around the country to see the art of butchery and taste the results.

In Busan, South Korea, she loves to educate guests about the Korean pantry and the region's flavor profiles by visiting local markets together. In Kobe, Japan, which is famous for beef, Oceania Cruises hosts an immersive tour

that takes guests from an ancient knife store to dinner in a beautiful restaurant that showcases local beef preparations.

"I'm really passionate about the fact that the brain needs exercise, and there's no better exercise than travel," Kelly says. "You hear different dialects and languages, try new foods and see new sights. It's enriching." Kelly and her team want to be an accessible bridge between travelers and the destinations they visit. "There's an obligation to make sure we're as educated as we can be to satisfy that curious traveler who wants to go beyond the basics," she says. "It's not a transactional relationship for us. We really care."

Chef Sara Moulton's *Guide to* Meaningful Travel

The legendary chef shares her approach to cultural immersion through local cuisine.

B

efore she became Julia Child's protégée, before her 25-year tenure at *Gourmet* magazine, and before hosting more than a thousand episodes of Food Network television shows,

Sara Moulton discovered her passion for food and travel at her family's kitchen table in New York City.

"My mom was a really good cook," Moulton recalls. "When I was in junior high, she started going to Europe. Wherever she went,

she'd come back and we'd have to make a meal from the place she had just visited. She'd go to Spain and we'd make paella. She'd go to Greece and we'd make moussaka."

Armed with Craig Claiborne's *The New York Times Cook Book* and access to ingredients from around the globe, young Sara became her mother's sous chef – an early apprenticeship that shaped her remarkable career.

After graduating from the Culinary Institute of America in 1977, Moulton worked in restaurants in Boston and New York before taking a job at *Gourmet* magazine, first in its test kitchen and later as chef of its executive dining room. While there, she served as the executive chef behind the scenes at ABC's *Good Morning America*, preparing dishes for guest chefs and cookbook authors before eventually stepping in front of the camera herself.

Today, as the host of PBS's *Sara's Weeknight Meals* and a member of Oceania Cruises' Culinary Advisory Board, Moulton continues her lifelong exploration of global cuisine.

Moulton recommends finding acafé to enjoy people-watching while reflecting on the day



“These are some of the best cooking classes I’ve ever taken,” she says of Oceania’s program. “The classes relate to the countries you’re visiting. They don’t give you recipes until the end of the class, which means you focus completely on what they’re doing.”

For her, food is the lens through which she experiences new destinations, combining culinary exploration with cultural immersion. Here, the seasoned chef and traveler explains how you can dive deep from day one of your next voyage.

Do Your Homework

“Before you go, research the restaurants, but try to find the cozy little local places as opposed to famous fancy ones. And visit supermarkets. You can learn a lot about a country from its supermarkets.” If you’re able to explore on foot, walk as much as possible. “I know it seems basic,” Moulton says, “but it’s a great way to see a city.”

Learn Local Etiquette

“You don’t have to learn the language. You just have to learn the niceties,” Moulton explains. “In France, if you go into a bakery and just say, ‘I want a croissant,’ they are not very happy. So go in, say ‘*Bonjour*,’ and make a little conversation before you order.”

Experience the Café Culture

“It’s so nice to just sit and watch the world go by,” says Moulton, who recommends visiting local cafés and other day-drinking destinations, like Barcelona’s beloved vermouth bars. At the end of each day of exploration, “have an aperitif or a glass of wine with whomever you’re with and just review the day,” she advises. “I know that seems obvious, but it’s important to review it so you remember it.”

Cook Like a Local

For those looking to deepen their culinary knowledge while traveling, Moulton enthusiastically endorses Oceania Cruises’ Culinary Center. “These are some of the best cooking classes I’ve ever taken, and they relate to the countries you’re visiting,” she says. “The instructors don’t give you recipes until the end of the class, which means you focus completely on what they’re doing instead of looking at a piece of paper. They explain each step and review the whole thing before you replicate it.”

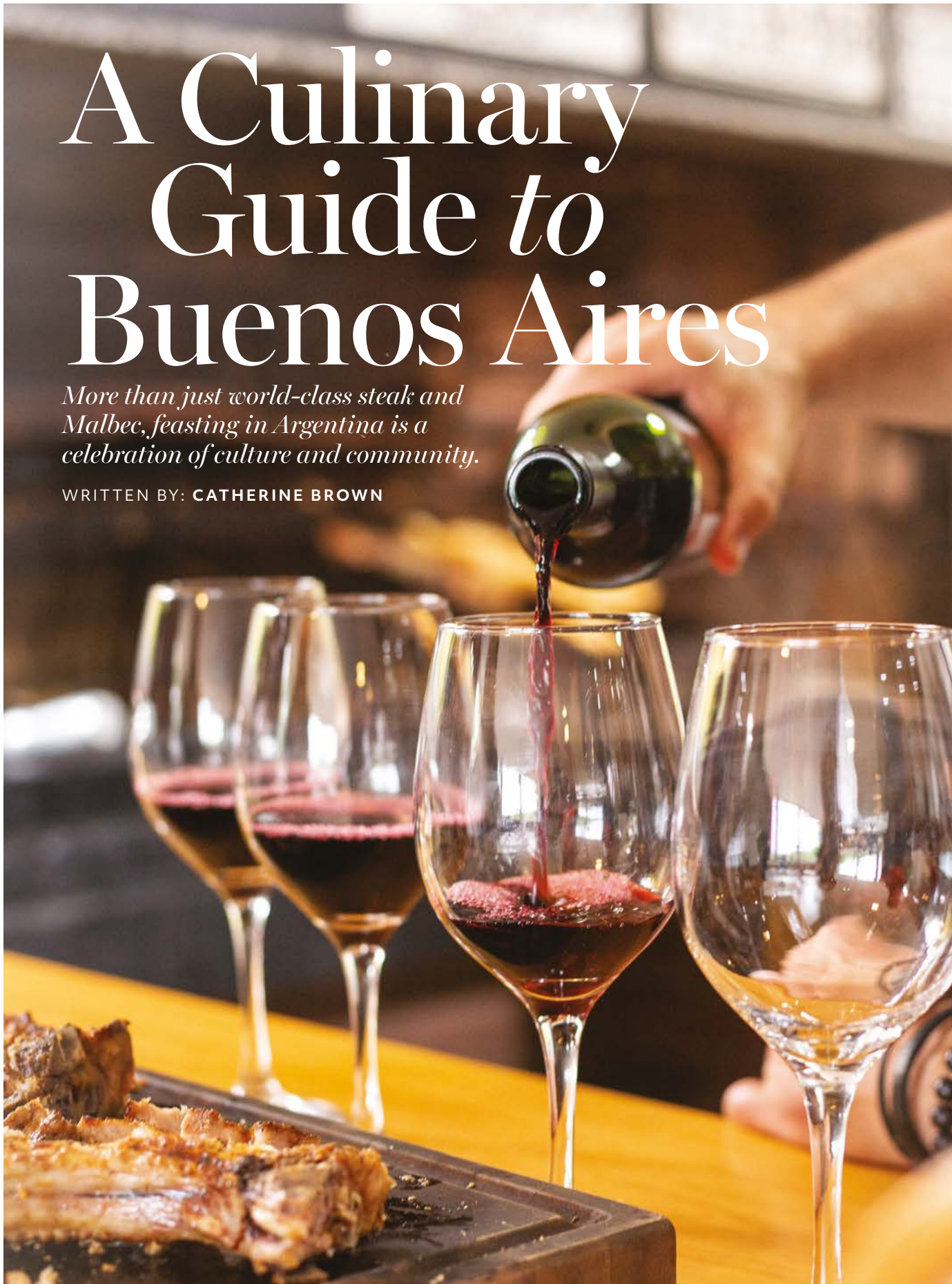

Ojo de bife

In Buenos Aires, Argentina's vibrant capital, food and drink provide so much more than mere sustenance. Here, *sobremesa*, the tradition of lingering at the table after a meal, is a cultural staple. The leisurely conversations enjoyed over wine or espresso can last for hours before anyone thinks to ask for the bill – because what could be more important than time with family and friends?

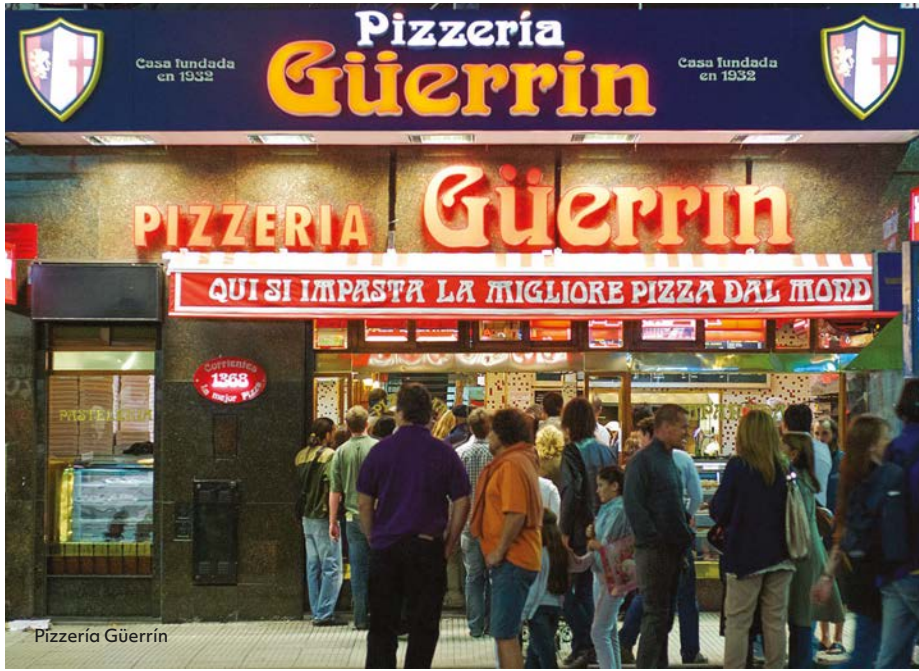
The urban landscape comprising greater Buenos Aires is sprawling, so knowing where to begin your exploration of the culinary scene can be daunting. But follow this guide to cherished favorites and you'll be eating like a local in no time.

A Cut Above

In a country known worldwide for its flavorful, tender and high-quality beef, trying the classic *ojo de bife* (ribeye) is a must. Argentines have a preference for well-done meat, so if you like yours pinker, ask the chef to keep it *jugoso* (juicy). If there's only room on your itinerary for one steak dinner, head to La Brigada in San Telmo, where soccer legend Diego Maradona loved to dine. The room is filled with soccer memorabilia, but white linen tablecloths, impeccable service and spoon-tender steak make it clear that this is no sports bar. Feeling adventurous? It's one of the best spots in the country to try *mollejas* (sweetbreads).

Taste of Italy

More than 60 percent of Argentines have some degree of Italian ancestry, and it shows in the city's culinary scene. For decadent homemade pasta, head to the centrally located D'Oro Italian Bar and order the fettuccine alla boscaiola with a side of creamy burrata. Most local restaurants don't open for dinner until 8 p.m. (with tables starting to fill an hour after that), but here, you can dine at 5 or 6 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday if you please.

If it's pizza you crave, the iconic Pizzeria Güerrin is hands down the best. Founded in 1932, this landmark is always packed with locals who come for traditional Argentine pies that are light on sauce and overflowing with cheese. To snag a table, you'll have to arrive during off-peak lunch and dinner hours. Or do as many locals do and stand at the bar while you savor your slice.

Beyond Beef

Argentinian cuisine is undeniably meat centric. In the past, it was difficult to find quality vegetarian, vegan or seafood-focused cuisine in Buenos Aires, but thankfully that's changed with the debut of restaurants including higher-end Sacro, cute-and-cozy Artemisia and raw-food-focused Buenos Aires Verde. To find the best vegetarian food, browse menus in the fashionable Palermo neighborhood.

Street Food Stars

No culinary tour of Buenos Aires – or Baires, as the locals say – is complete without diving headfirst into street food staples. There’s the messy *choripán* (chorizo on bread slathered in chimichurri sauce), gooey ham-and-cheese empanadas, or the classic *sandwich de milanesa* (featuring breaded chicken or beef). The massive indoor market in the bohemian neighborhood of San Telmo is the perfect place to munch and meander on a budget. If you can visit on a Sunday, make time to browse the arts and crafts displayed throughout the nearby street fair.


Malbec and More

Yes, Argentina’s beloved Malbec wine flows in abundance in Buenos Aires, but there are other Argentine varietals

that deserve a taste, including the fresh and aromatic white wine Torrontés. For quality wines without any pretense, head to Hache Almacén in Palermo, where you’ll find a large by-the-glass list and tasty tapas. If a fantastic cocktail is more your speed, compare the three local spots that earned a place on the list of the World’s 50 Best Bars 2024. Tres Monos and CoChinChina, both in Palermo, placed No. 7 and No. 22 respectively, while Florería Atlántico, in Retiro, snagged the 46th spot. To end an evening in a memorable way, order a fernet and soda at San Telmo’s Bar El Federal, which opened in 1864 and hasn’t changed much since. There, fashionable patrons linger over newspapers at the antique bar as the soulful strains of tango music fill the air, offering a timeless glimpse into Buenos Aires’ embrace of leisurely moments and art of savoring life.

GO BIRDING AT AN ARCHITECTURAL MARVEL

Singapore is known as the Garden City, but it's tough to grasp just how lush it is from street level. At Henderson Waves, the country's highest pedestrian bridge at 120 feet above ground (and a 30-minute walk from Singapore Cruise Centre), you can observe wildlife like tropical songbirds and long-tailed macaques, and enjoy sweeping views of the island. In the evenings, the entire platform is illuminated in soft LED lighting, giving the area a romantic vibe. Panoramas aside, the bridge itself is an architectural stunner, with voluptuous curves made of native Balau wood that echo the natural environment, and plenty of shaded spots to rest and admire the landscape.
